Friday, October 3, 2025

Early morning **flights** from your local airport.

Arrive at Charleston International Airport and board your motorcoach for an afternoon of touring.

Enjoy lunch on your own at The Citadel followed by a **tour of the Citadel**. Afterward, take your seats for the **dress parade** - The tradition of parading troops can be traced back to the time of Alexander the Great. Drill procedures and movements on the parade field are identical to the tactical maneuvers employed on the battlefield in the past. U.S. military reviews and parades began at Valley Forge. At that time, brigades of soldiers were formed in order of battle. Modern-day ceremonies are conducted to inspect troops, render honors, preserve tradition, and foster esprit de corps. At various times throughout the year, The Citadel's parades are used to present awards and recognize students, faculty, staff, and other notable people.

Check-in for your **three-night stay** at the Hampton Inn & Suites Charleson/Mt Pleasant – Isle of Palms in Mt. Pleasant, SC. Baggage handling is included.

Enjoy included **group welcome dinner** at a local restaurant.

Saturday, October 4, 2025

Enjoy an included hotel **breakfast** at your leisure.

Depart for a day of touring to include the Palmetto Carriage Works, complete with a horse drawn carriage ride through historic Charleston, exploring City Market with plenty of time for lunch on own, a Charleston Harbor Cruise, and wine reception on the porch of the Edmonston-Alston House along with a self-guided tour. Commanding a magnificent view of Charleston Harbor, the Edmonston-Alston House has witnessed many historic moments in the port city's history. One of the oldest houses along the High Battery, it withstood the American Civil War, the Earthquake of 1886, and numerous hurricanes; it has survived to share a piece of Charleston history. Docents are stationed on each floor to answer questions and interact with guests.

Enjoy a group **dinner** at Charleston Crab House – James Island.

Sunday, October 5, 2025

Enjoy an included hotel breakfast at your leisure.

Depart for another full day including a guided tour of the **Mcleod Plantation Historic Site**, lunch on own along **Shem Creek**, and exploring **Boone Hall Plantation**. Make sure to take part in the Plantation tractor tour, which highlights the 738-acre active working farm.

Enjoy a group **dinner** at a local restaurant.

Monday, October 6, 2025

Enjoy an included hotel breakfast at your leisure before checking out.

Your full day of touring begins at the **Charleston Tea Garden**, which includes factory, trolley, and greenhouse tours complete with **boxed lunch**. Next stop is **Lady's Island Oyster** for an educational and tasting experience. From there, make stops at the **Kazoo Factory Museum** and the **Rotten Little Bastard Distillery**.
